Please list any ailments or problems we would need to know about in case of emergency, and any that would affect your ability to participate fully in the program at Dharma Rain Zen Center. Also, list any prescriptions for psychotropic drugs you might have, and why you are taking them.

3. Do you have any history of drug or alcohol problems? _____ Are you now, or have you ever been, a regular participant in a 12-step program? _____ If "yes", please supply a brief description of your history, including how you feel you are doing now. Also, state if there any special way being at the Center could be of help to you.

4. Do you have any history of mental or emotional problems?______ Specifically: have you ever been hospitalized for mental or emotional problems ______; have you ever been on medication for mental or emotional problems ______; have you ever consulted a psychiatrist, psychologist, or therapist for mental or emotional problems _____? Please write a brief explanation for any "yes" answer.

5. Please write a brief explanation of what you see as your main purpose in taking up residency at the Zen Center. Be down to earth. Focus on where you are in your practice now, and what changes in your life you would like to effect. Also: how long a stay do you have in mind?

6. What expectations do you have about living at the Center? Write a little about what you think you might enjoy the most, what you think will be the most difficult, and what you hope to learn. What do you expect the teachers to provide? How much daily zazen do you expect? How much reading and study? How much work? How much personal direction?

7. Write a brief description of yourself. Are you outgoing, a people person? Or are you self contained, quiet? Think of the words you would use to describe yourself (i.e., thoughtful, adventurous, gregarious, reliable, intelligent, intuitive, spontaneous, feeling, intense, sensitive, complicated, uncomplicated, careful, straightforward, etc.).
